Making Installment Payments

The Commission, in accordance with instructions from the U.S. Department of Treasury, can offer you two installment payment options, both which require payment to Mellon Bank, our lockbox bank, in Pittsburgh, PA.

The first payment option, Auction Installment Payment (AIP) program, is a method by which you authorize Mellon Bank to automatically debit your account, utilizing either a toll-free number or a computer terminal.

The second payment option, Automated Clearing House (ACH) Credit Program or CCD+, is a method by which you authorize your bank to create a payment from your account directly to Mellon Bank.

After license grant and after you have paid your remaining down-payment you will receive a letter indicated the date your first payment is due along with your quarterly payment schedules and an installment payment package. You must read the installment payment package in order to make the selection that best suit your business needs. At that time you will select one of the two payment option mentioned above. If you decide to use the first payment option you must promptly return the "Masterfile Maintenance Form". The Masterfile Maintenance Form can be located on page 19 of the installment payment package. If you decide to select the second payment option, you must contact your financial institution and make the necessary arrangements.

FCC GENERAL OVERVIEW

What Is the Federal Communications Commission AIP Program?

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Auction Installment Payment (AIP) Program is a convenient, safe and reliable way for your organization to make your quarterly auction installment payments. The FCC AIP has been developed by the FCC in conjunction with Mellon Bank especially for FCC Auction Installment Payment.

With FCC AIP, you simply call Mellon's toll-free telephone number or input your payment via a computer terminal at least one business day before your payment is due by 8:15 PM, EST. Mellon electronically processes your payments to FCC the next business day. (Either an ACH¹ or DTC² is generated against your bank account based on your payment report.)

The phone call or terminal entry takes only a few minutes. Mellon Bank does the rest.

This brochure, developed with Mellon Bank, describes how easy it is to use the FCC AIP Program.

How Do You or Your Organization Benefit with FCC AIP?

You or your organization maintain control of the payment date and amount. You know exactly when your funds will be moved from your account and in what amount. This lets you plan your cash flow accurately.

The AIP avoids delays and saves the time and expense involved in writing checks.

AIP is protected by excellent security measures that prevent unauthorized entry to your checking account. You are given a unique personal identification number (PIN) that you use to initiate transactions. This number is known only to you and Mellon. FCC does not have access to the number. Your local bank account is debited only on your instructions.

¹ ACH or Automated Clearing House means a domestic funds transfer system providing an electronic parallel to the Federal Reserve check clearing system. ACH is governed by the Rules of the National Automated Clearing House Association. Generally, speaking, an ACH is an instrument for moving money electronically from one participating financial institution to another.

² DTC or Depository Transfer Check is a preprinted, unsigned, restricted-payee check generated by a cash concentration system when an ACH can't be initiated. This is usually because one of the financial institutions involved in the transaction is not an ACH participant. A DTC will also be initiated in lieu of an ACH when the ACH is in prenote.

How Do You Report Payments?

At least one business day before your payment is due, either call Mellon Bank's operator-assisted toll-free telephone number, 1-800-944-1400 or use terminal entry to initiate your payment before 8:15 P.M. EST.

When Will Your Account Be Debited?

Your bank account will be debited and your FCC auction installment account will be credited the business day after you initiate your payment (assuming this is done by 8:15 P.M. EST). **EXAMPLE:** If the payment is due on a Monday, you must initiate the payment no later than 8:15 P.M. EST the Friday before.

Your funds must be on deposit the next business day following your payment report. Mellon will notify FCC immediately if there are not sufficient funds in your account to cover your payment amount.

There is no need for you to change banks or open a special account to use FCC AIP. All of the transactions can be handled through your existing local bank checking account.

What Protection Does FCC AIP Offer?

You are assigned a four-digit PIN by Mellon. This number is known only to you and cannot be accessed by FCC. Once you give your information to the Mellon operator or input the information via the terminal, you will receive a verification code confirming that Mellon received your information.

All operator-assisted phone calls are made on a recorded line and kept on file by Mellon for 60 days so that they can be reviewed if questions arise.

How Do I Get Started on the Program?

Getting started is very easy. Simply complete the set-up form (Masterfile Maintenance Form, the last page of this packet) and mail it to the address indicated on the form itself. Once you are set up, Mellon Bank will mail PIN notification to you. Allow three to four weeks for completion of the set up and receipt of your PIN.

How Do I Enter Transactions?

Operator-Assisted Dialogues demonstrating how to report your payments and supplemental fields are found on pages 9 through 11.

Terminal Entry Dialogues are found on pages 12 through 15. Equipment needs are defined below if you are using a Personal Computer (PC) to communicate:

- A) Communications software package
- B) modem
- C) RS232 or modem cable
- D) Serial port (may be included as part of your PC)

NOTE: if you are planning on using an internal modem, the serial port and cable are not necessary.

Additional Questions

FCC AIP is designed to save you both time and money. Some commonly asked questions concerning this new form of paying accounts are listed below with accompanying answers.

Q. How much does this service cost?

- A. Nothing. FCC AIP is provided at no cost to you.

Q. Will FCC AIP work with my present checking account?

- A. Yes. It can be used with your present checking account. All transactions will appear on your bank statement.

Q. What if my bank cannot handle electronic transactions?

- A. For those banks that cannot process electronic entries, Depository Transfer Checks (DTC) will be initiated. These are checks produced by the bank on your behalf in place of electronic transactions.

Q. When will my bank account be debited?

- A. Your bank account will be charged on the next business day after you report your payment.

Q. How will I be able to tell what my daily bank account balance is?

A. Enter the payment amount and date in your checkbook as you would if you wrote a check or if you were making a withdrawal from a banking machine.

Q. What happens if I do not have enough funds in my checking account to cover the AIP payment?

A. The AIP payment will not post to your local account but be returned (NSF) to Mellon Bank who will notify FCC that the payment has not been completed. It will be handled similar to presenting a check on an account without sufficient funds. Your bank may charge you an overdraft fee for non-sufficient funds (according to their particular fee schedule).

Q. Can I change the payment or payment information at a later time after I have reported it to a Mellon operator or through Terminal Entry?

A. Yes. You can make changes or corrections to your payment or payment information. Changes or corrections can be reported up to 8:15 P.M. Eastern Time on the day that the payment or payment information was reported to the FCC AIP system.

Q. Will I receive a canceled check?

A. The electronic transaction will appear on your monthly bank statement. There will NOT be a corresponding canceled check unless a DTC was generated.

Q. What receipt date will my payment receive?

A. Assuming the payment is initiated before 8:15 PM, EST on a normal business day (Monday - Friday), FCC will recognize your payment as being made the next business day.

INFORMATION TO BE REPORTED

What Information Is Reported?

Information you report will include your:

- **FCC Company Number** - this is 1146 and was assigned by Mellon Bank.
- **Unit Number(s)** - your unit number consists of your FCC Account Number (see definition below) plus a two digit suffix. The two digit suffix will be 01, 02, 03, 04, or 05 based on the number of payments you need to make. (You will need a different Unit Number for every 15 payments made on a given business day.)

EXAMPLE: Your FCC Account Number is 0123456789. Therefore, your Unit Numbers are: 012345678901, 012345678902, 012345678903, 012345678904, 012345678905. Then, on a given day, you have 37 payments to initiate. The first 15 payments will be made under Unit Number 012345678901, the next 15 payments will be made under Unit Number 012345678902, and the last 7 payments will be made under Unit Number 012345678903.

Note: If you will need to make more than 75 payments on any day, you must request additional capacity at least two weeks before needing to make the payments. To request additional capacity, contact the FCC Billing & Collections Branch at 202-418-1995. (For each additional 15 payments you need to make, you will be assigned another Unit Number - incrementing the suffix by one.)

- **Personal Identification Number (PIN)** - is assigned by Mellon and mailed directly to you.
- **Payment Amount** - also referred to as Unit Amount. This is the amount being paid for one particular license. DO NOT enter the decimal point - the system will assume that the last two digits entered are cents.
- **FCC Account Number** - is the self-assigned personal identification number that consists of ten digits. You must use your taxpayer identification number (TIN) with a prefix of "0" (e.g., 0123456789). Only if you do not have a TIN, you may use your ten-digit telephone number (e.g., 3012224567). There are no other options available to you to create your FCC Account No.

- **Payor Name** - the first 5 alphabetic characters of the payor's name.
- **License Number** - the 8 to 12 alpha-numeric character license number that was assigned by the FCC. If your license number is less than 12 characters, only enter the actual license number - DO NOT fill with zeros or spaces.

NOTE: When you make a phone call or use terminal entry, your payment information will enter the system while you are on the line.

NOTE: After the payment is complete, you will receive a four-digit verification code. This is provided with either Operator-assisted or terminal entry. This verification code along with your unit number, unit amount, and date of entry will serve as proof of your payment and enable research should there ever be a discrepancy. **THEREFORE, IT IS VITAL THAT YOU LOG AND MAINTAIN THIS INFORMATION.**

Application for Mobile Radio Service Authorization or Rural Radiotelephone Service Authorization

OVERVIEW

Purpose of Form

Form FCC 600 is used to apply or to amend a pending application for an authorization to operate one or more radio stations in any of the land mobile radio services established by the FCC (except for the General Mobile Radio Service) and in the Rural Radiotelephone Service. The purpose of this form is to collect data and other information pertaining to the proposed radio stations. This data is used by the FCC to determine whether the public interest would be served by a grant of the requested authorization. Form FCC 600 replaces Form FCC 401 for all purposes and Form FCC 574 for most purposes.

Introduction

Form FCC 600 is a multi-part form comprising a main form and several optional schedules. Each application or amendment must contain one and only one main form (pages 1 and 2), but may contain as few or as many of the optional schedules as necessary. Some of the schedules are also used as attachments to Form FCC 489.

The Main Form

The purpose of the main form is to obtain information sufficient to identify the filer, establish the filer's basic eligibility and qualifications, to classify the filing, and to determine the nature of the proposed service. Space is also provided for filing fee information. The main form also contains the required certification and signature block. The main form is required for every application or amendment filed on Form FCC 600.

The Schedules

The purposes of the schedules are as follows:

SCHEDULE A

One Schedule A is required for each application or amendment in the radio services governed by Part 22 or Part 24 of FCC rules. These services are the Personal Communications Service, the Cellular Radiotelephone Service, the Paging and Radiotelephone Service, the Rural Radiotelephone Service, the Offshore Radiotelephone Service and the Air-ground Radiotelephone Service. Schedule A indicates the purpose of the filing. It is the only schedule needed for initial systems where no site specific data is being submitted, and for requests for extension of time to construct facilities. Schedule A must not be filed with Schedules D or E.

SCHEDULE B

Schedule B is used when site-specific data is required for applications, amendments or notifications involving individual channel assignments, in the radio services for which Schedule A is required. At least one Schedule B must be filed for each location for which data is required. Schedule B provides location data, information concerning proximity to market boundaries, technical information concerning the antennas and transmitters at the particular location, radial power and antenna height data, and information about points of communication for transmitters at the particular location. Each Schedule B can hold data for multiple antennas at one location by using additional copies of page 2. For each antenna, Schedule B can hold data for up to four transmitters and/or channels. Additional Schedule Bs may be filed for the same location or antenna if necessary.

SCHEDULE C

Schedule C is used when site-specific data is required for applications, amendments or notifications in the radio services for which Schedule A is required and for which spectrum is assigned in channel blocks. One Schedule C must be filed for each location for which data is required. Schedule C provides location data, technical parameters of the facility at the particular location, radial power and antenna height data.

SCHEDULE D

Schedule D is required for applications and amendments in all radio services for which Form FCC 600 may be used, except those for which Schedule A is required. It provides additional administrative data for stations in these services.

SCHEDULE E

Schedule E is required for applications and amendments in all radio services for which Form FCC 600 may be used, except those for which Schedule A is required. It provides station location data for stations in these services.

SCHEDULE F

Schedule F is required when permanent location data is submitted on Schedule B, C or E. However, in some services (e.g. PCS), applicants may need to obtain antenna clearance independent of the system authorization by filing Form FCC 854. See the pertinent part(s) of the FCC rules.

SCHEDULE G

Schedule G is required for applications and amendments in all radio services for which Form FCC 600 may be used, except those for which Schedule A is required. It provides technical data for stations in these services. The reverse side of Schedule G provides for additional frequencies. Additional Schedule Gs may be filed if necessary.

SCHEDULE H

Schedule H is required for applications and amendments in the Remote Pickup Broadcast Auxiliary Radio Service for permanent location stations and for land mobile stations operating on frequencies lower than 27.5 MHz. Failure to include this schedule when required will result in the return of the application without further action. Land mobile stations located near international borders that seek protection from interference should complete Schedule H.

Schedules Required (For filings other than Part 22 and Part 24)

If the application to be submitted includes fixed or permanent location stations (A - F), complete the Main Form, Schedule D, Schedule E, Schedule F and Schedule G. Schedule H must also be completed for fixed location stations proposed in the Remote Pickup Broadcast Auxiliary Radio Service. Schedule H must also be completed for all stations proposing to operate on frequencies below 27.5 MHz.

If the application to be submitted includes only control stations meeting the 20 foot criteria, mobile, temporary or itinerant locations (G - Z), complete Form 600 Main Form, Schedule D, Schedule E and Schedule G.

Applicable Rules and Regulations

Before the application is prepared, applicant should review the relevant part of the FCC rules in Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Copies of Title 47 may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, DC 20402. FCC rules generally require various exhibits to be filed with an application in addition to the information requested in the application form. Quiet Zone

The quiet zone is a restricted area of operation within Virginia, West Virginia, and Garrett County, Maryland in the vicinity of the National Radio Astronomy Observatory, Green Bank, Pocahontas County, West Virginia. Permanent Stations in this area should be checked for compliance with applicable Commission rules. If the permanent station, including control stations meeting the 20 foot criteria, is bounded by 39° 15' N on the north, 78° 30' W on the east, 37° 30' N on the south, and 80° 30' W on the west, the application must be accompanied by a copy of the clearance obtained from the National Radio Astronomy Observatory. The request for clearance must be sent to: National Radio Astronomy Observatory, P.O. Box 2, Green Bank, West Virginia 24944.

FILING INSTRUCTIONS

Paper Copies

The number of paper copies of this application required to be filed varies depending on the radio service. Refer to the pertinent part of the FCC rules for specific instructions.

Packages

The Main Form and the applicable schedules should be submitted as one package, stapled in the upper left corner. The Main Form should be first with the following schedules in alphabetical order.

Microfiche Copies (For Part 22 and Part 24 filings only)

Applications on Form FCC 600 for authority to operate facilities in the radio services governed by Part 22 or Part 24 of the FCC rules must be filed in microfiche form. See the pertinent part of the FCC rules to determine how this requirement applies. If microfiche is required, submit three microfiche (one original and two copies). Each microfiche must be a copy of the signed original. Each microfiche copy must be a 148mm X 105mm negative (clear transparent characters appearing on an opaque background) at 24X to 27X reduction for microfiche or microfiche jackets. One of the microfiche sets must be a silver halide camera master or a copy made on silver halide film such as Kodak Direct Duplicating Film. The microfiche must be placed in paper microfiche envelopes and submitted in a 5" x 7.5" envelope. Row "A" (the first row for page images) of the first microfiche must be left blank.

Processing Fee

Items 9-16 These items identify the contact representative (usually the headquarters office of a large applicant, the law firm or other representative of the applicant, or the person or company that prepared or submitted the application on behalf of the applicant). CLASSIFICATION OF FILING

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Item 28 This item is required for compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 4321-4335. See also Part 1, Subpart I of the FCC rules (47 CFR 1.1301-1.1319). This item must be answered, either "Y" or "N". MARKET / CHANNEL BLOCK

Item A2 This item must be answered only if the filing is for an authorization in one of the radio services that is licensed on a geographic licensing area or "market" basis (e.g. Cellular Radio Service). It identifies the market to which the filing pertains. The market designators are listed in FCC Public Notices or in the FCC Record. This item should not be answered for filings in radio services licensed on a station-by-station basis.

Item A3 This item must be answered only if the filing is for an authorization in one of the radio services for which spectrum is assigned in channel blocks. For filings in the Cellular Radio Service, the answer to this item is either "A" or "B". For filings in the Air-ground Radiotelephone Service (commercial aviation), the answer to this item is "C-" followed by a number between 1 and 29 (e.g. C-17). This item should not be answered for filings in radio services in which channels are individually assigned.

Item A4 This item must be answered only if the filing is for an authorization in one of the radio services that is licensed on a geographic licensing area or "market" basis and the market has been subdivided.

Item A5 This item must be answered only if the filing is for an authorization in one of the radio services that is licensed on a geographic licensing area or "market" basis (e.g. Cellular Radio Service). In addition to item A2, it identifies the market to which the filing pertains. The market names are listed in FCC Public Notices or in the FCC Record. This item should not be answered for filings in radio services licensed on a station by station basis.

CONTROL POINTS

Items A6-A9 These items provide the location(s) of the station or system control points, and the telephone number(s) where a person responsible for operation of the station or system could be reached, if necessary. These items must be answered only for new systems or stations and when a control point is to be added, deleted or modified. These items do not have to be answered for broadcast subcarrier paging (i.e. if the answer to item A1 is "O"). If a control point modification is the only purpose of the filing, answer item A1 "S" and file Schedule A as an attachment to Form FCC 489, rather than Form FCC 600. To move an existing control point or change a telephone number, delete the old information and add the new.

FACILITIES NOT CONSTRUCTED

Items A10-A12 These items must be completed only in connection with (1) filings that request an extension of time to construct specific facilities in services where locations are individually subject to a construction period requirement, and the rest of the station or system has been completed; (2) notifications, using Schedule A as an attachment, reporting that a system has been partially constructed.
